- 8. Approval for SMSS to apply for the competitive library grant, *Improving Literacy Through School Libraries*, worth \$350,000. This grant will help improve reading achievement by providing students with increased access to up-to-date school library resources, including books, acquire and use advanced technology that is integrated into the curricula, and provide professional development that will increase collaboration among library specialists, teachers, and administrators. The application will be written and submitted by Benchmark Education at no cost to the district.
- 9. Approval for Regis A. Vitale to complete Learning Disability evaluations to insure students are tested to meet statutory time constraints at a cost of \$250.00 per evaluation. The district is currently short two LDTC's and the amount of evaluations required is exceeding their ability to complete the evaluations within mandated time guidelines. The cost of the evaluations will be paid via ARRA funds, account # 20-252-200-300-0000-400.
- 10. Approval of the Middle School Baseball, Track, and Softball practices and away games for the 2009-2010 school-year (Attached).

- 11. Approval of the High School Prom. The prom will be held on May 22, 2010, at Flanders hotel in Ocean City from 7:00-11:30 pm. The cost is \$75.00 per student and the money will be collected from students and deposited into Account #2011. When the prom is over Flanders will receive payment out of Account #2011.
- 12. Approval to pay Year 2 contracted services with Tools of the Mind Curriculum Developer. The Early Childhood department has committed to a two year contract (2008-2009 & 2009-2010) with the Tools of the Mind curriculum developer, Metropolitan State College of Denver @ \$2,000.00 per 39 classroom(s) for a total of \$78,000.00 per year. Services provided are: (3) full day workshops, technical assistance via conference calls and (12) site visits to all district and provider early childhood sites throughout the school year. Metropolitan State College of Denver has already provided the majority of services to the district. Account #20-218-200-300-0001-234.

- Resolution to implement Read 180 at all grade levels. Read 180 has been proven to have a positive impact on student achievement across multiple grade levels and multiple types of student populations. Hardware will be purchased for the program. Middle School \$85,401.25 and High School \$62,487.00. All funds will be paid out of ARRA stimulus money account #20-252-100-600-0000-400.
- 14. Resolution to accept Early Childhood Decatur Avenue Playground Beatification Project. Through Project Playground, staff, students, and community members will plant flowers, beautify the surrounding area, and erect a small playground drafted especially for the Decatur Avenue site. All materials and labor will be donated by area businesses.
- 15. Approval to apply for the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act Formula Grant funds in the amount of \$600,000.00. The Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act Formula Grant funds to establish programs to increase student attendance, engagement and attachment to school by implementing truancy reduction programming. The target population of this Notice of Availability of Funds (NOAF) is absent and/or truant youth, requiring intervention to reattach/reengage in the education process, who are at-risk of academic failure, expulsion or dropout as demonstrated by a high rate of or excessive absenteeism.
