- 9. Report of the Business Administrator/Board Secretary: Mr. Dennis Mulvihill

Mr. Mulvihill shared with the Board and the Public the information from the Legislative update regarding the Annual School Board Election. The Senate Bill 31-48, Assembly Bill 43-94 passed in vote the Senate and Assembly on January 9, 2012 and sent to the Governor. These bills establish procedures for districts, municipalities, or voters to

opt to move the school annual election to November, and eliminate vote on the school budget to such districts, except for separate proposals to spend above the cap. The law is not in effect until the Governor signs it. They will let us know if that happens. The election is on April 17, 2012 – unless its moved. He added that the 2012 Candidate Kits and Petitions will be available in the Pleasantville Board of Education Business Office starting Wednesday, January 11, 2012.

The District would have to take action to move the election date to November. We will get further clarification on that from the New Jersey Association of School Business Officials, New Jersey School Board Association, and our solicitor.

Report of the State Fiscal Monitor: Mr. James Riehman is welcomed back by Mrs. Graves
