1. APPOINTMENT OF ACTING TREASURER OF SCHOOL MONIES

2. OFFICIAL DEPOSITORIES

Recommend Action on Resolution Designating Official Depositories for the Funds of the Board.

BE IT RESOLVED by this Board of Education that the TD Bank, Sun Bank, N.A., The Bank of New York, PNC Bank, Wells Fargo, New Jersey Arbitrage and Rebate Management designated as official depositories for the funds of this Board.

The State's comprehensive educational reform vision is to ensure that all children, regardless of life circumstances, graduate from high school ready for college and career. The Race to the Top Phase 3 (RTTT3) subgrant program will help New Jersey greatly advance its priority initiatives so this vision can be realized. On December 22, 2011, New Jersey received \$37,847,648 from RTTT3 to support the following initiatives: The development of a model curriculum by Fall 2012, aligned to the Common Core State Standards (CCSS) and with a focus on Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) to support the statewide transition to the CCSS; The development of an Instructional Improvement System (IIS), an online portal to deliver model curriculum, formative assessments, data reporting, professional development resources, and other curricular resources aligned to the CCSS, to the schoollevel; The transition to new principal and teacher evaluation systems; and Support for the State's charter application and renewal review cycles.

Project Periods: Year 1 is from July 1, 2012-December 31, 2012 Year 2 is from January 1, 2013-December 31, 2013 Year 3 is from January 1, 2014- December 31, 2014 Year 4 is form January 1, 2015- November 30, 2015

PLEASANTVILLE BOARD OF EDUCATION WORK/ACTION BOARD MEETING Policy/Pupil Matters March 13, 2012 MINUTES

POLICY

- A. Resolution to approve Regulation 8310 Public Records (OPRA). <u>Background:</u> The district's Policy fully complies with current statutory requirements. However, the Regulation was not fully compliant. The Regulation as it should read is attached. The material that is in "bold" contains the revised language.
- B. Resolution to approve the First Reading of Policy 1631 Residency Requirement for Person Holding School District Office, Employment, or Position

<u>Background:</u> The "New Jersey First Act" establishes residency requirements for all persons holding office, employment, or a position in a New Jersey school district. Policy 1631 has been developed to incorporate the provisions of this new law. Although the law does not mandate a policy, it is highly recommended a district consider adopting a policy regarding this law.

- C. Resolution to approve Policy 2431 Athletic Competition (Revised MANDATED) <u>Background:</u> Policy 2431 has been revised as a result of New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association's (NJSIAA) recent policy permitting home schooled children to participate in a school district's interscholastic athletic program and set forth requirements for participation in High School sports.
- D. Resolution to approve the First Reading of Policy 3324 Right of Privacy Teaching Staff Resolution to approve the First Reading of Policy 4324 Right of Privacy Support Staff Members Background: This issue is governed by Federal Court decisions interpreting the Fourth Amendment of the United States Constitution. The Federal Courts determine whether a public employee maintains an expectation of privacy on a case-by-case basis depending on specific facts. However, Courts have consistently determined there is a reduced expectation of privacy for searches conducted pursuant to an investigation of work-related employee misconduct, by legitimate policies or regulations, or with reasonable suspicion the staff member is violating a law or school policy. Policy 3324 and 4324 have been developed to inform school employees this reduced expectation of privacy may result in school property being searched without a search warrant.
- E. Resolution to approve Policy and Regulation 5600 Pupil Discipline/Code of Conduct <u>Background:</u> Similar to the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act, the new dating violence at school law requires consequences and remedial/intervention measures for acts or incidents of dating violence at school. The Dating Violence Policy and Regulation were passed by the BOE on January 24, 2012. The listing of consequences and remedial/intervention measures should also be included in the school district's Pupil Discipline/Code of Conduct.
- F. Resolution to approve the First Reading of Policy 8613 Waiver of Pupil Transportation

<u>Background:</u> N.J.S.A. 18A:39-1c permits a school district to not provide transportation to and from school for a pupil who lives remote from their school if the parent/guardian provides a signed written statement the pupil waives transportation services for that school year. The law further requires the district's policy have a provision allowing this waiver to be revised by a parent/guardian in the case of family or economic hardship. This is not a mandated policy guide, but has the potential to increase transportation efficiency and reduce transportation costs.

G. Resolution to approve Policy and Regulation 9270 – Home Schooling and Equivalent Education outside the Schools

<u>Background:</u> Policy and Regulation Guides 9270 require revision as a result of New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association's (NJSIAA) recent policy permitting home schooled children to participate in a school district's interscholastic athletic program. The district has the option to permit a home schooled child to participate in a school district's interscholastic athletic program provided NJSIAA recently published guidelines are met. Rather than restate this option in Policy and Regulation Guides 9270, these Guides have been revised to indicate any participation by a home schooled child in the regular school program, in an extra-curricular program, or sports activities will be in accordance with Board Policy or if required by Federal law, or State statute or administrative code. This policy language limits the Board's position on this issue to one policy - Policy 2431.

H. Resolution to approve the Second Reading and Adoption of 6472 – Tuition Assistance, Second Reading and Adoption

<u>Background:</u> P.L. 2010, Chapter 13 (N.J.S.A. 18A:6-8.5) was approved on May 6, 2010. The new statute indicates, "The tuition assistance or additional compensation shall be provided only for a course or degree related to the employee's current or future job responsibilities.

I. Resolution to approve Policy 0168 – Recording Board Meetings

<u>Background:</u> Several legal cases held that a public Board may establish reasonable guidelines for public video recording of its proceedings.

J. Resolution to approve Policy 9181 – Volunteer Athletic Coaches and Co-Curricular Activity Advisors/Assistants

<u>Background:</u> Policy Guide 9181 has been expanded to include volunteers who help with co-curricular activities other than sports. In addition, this Policy Guide requires a criminal history record check for these volunteers with the cost to be reimbursed to the applicant by the Board.
