

Deadlines, Deadlines

Seniors have the daunting task of meeting more deadlines. Submitting homework, term papers, and other projects by certain deadlines, will now prove to be a necessary skill. Submission of college information **must** meet deadlines to qualify.

All students with post graduation plans must complete all admission applications by November 26, 2012. This is the

benchmark date for first choice colleges/universities or any branch of the armed forces. Paper applications and confirmations (online applications) must be submitted to your guidance counselors by the above deadline.

Submitting everything yourselves could hinder acceptance and opportunity to receive your 1st bid. Counselors generally send transcripts and other documents to colleges/

universities, etc., because transcripts are marked **"official"** and **"sealed."** An additional perk is that counselors will also mail documents to respected destinations, which amounts to free postage for the student.

If any student wishes to forward documents themselves, please speak to your counselor first to ensure that all documents are valid and certified. Follow these simple deadline procedures and your efforts will not be dead in the water.
