



C.A.R.E 21st CCLC Program Snapshot 2024-25

The C.A.R.E. Nita M. Lowey 21st CCLC program strives to support student academic achievement through district-wide afterschool programs focusing on STEM awareness, technological competency, and positive youth development. The C.A.R.E. program serves students in grades 3 through 12 across Pleasantville Public Schools in its four elementary schools as well as in the district Middle and High Schools.



School Day Attendance



On average, each participant in Pleasantville's C.A.R.E. program attended school for 148 days of the 180 day school year marking an 82% school day attendance rate for 21st CCLC youth.

Positive Behavioral Supports




Only 3% of C.A.R.E. participants across elementary and middle school program sites experienced school day disciplinary referrals between October 2024 and May 2025.

Meaningful Family Engagement



C.A.R.E. families attended over 47 hours of engagement events including multi-cultural celebrations, family games nights, fall festivals, Kwanza celebrations, and community events sponsored by C.A.R.E. program staff and collaborators.



The program exceeded its target level of service of 176 participants, enrolling and retaining 347 participants across six school sites serving students in grades three through eight attending Pleasantville Public Schools.

Hours of youth development, arts and cultural programs offered to C.A.R.E. participants.

Program Outcomes

Here's what key C.A.R.E. program stakeholders have to say about the 21st CCLC Program.



72% of program staff strongly agree that C.A.R.E. provides opportunities for the work, achievements, or accomplishments of youth to be publicly recognized.

89% of program staff report that they frequently meet with one or more parents.

71% of program staff indicate that they actively and continuously consult and involve youth.



83% of program parents rate the quality of the C.A.R.E. 21st CCLC program as "excellent".

94% of program parents report that they have seen improvements in their child's self-esteem since beginning the after school program.

97% of program parents feel that the C.A.R.E. program helps their child complete their homework with greater ease.



81% of C.A.R.E. participants report that the after school program promotes a sense of belonging.

70% of participants feel that staff value their feedback about programs and activities.

84% of program participants always or most always look forward to coming to the C.A.R.E. program.

69% of participants feel that the after school program has helped them to feel happier or less stressed.
